# Logo

The logo known as the 'PHN Identifier' is a strong, cohesive and easily identifiable brand, developed to ensure:

- branding consistency across all PHNs;
- recognition of the support PHNs receive from the department of Health and Aged Care (DoHAC); and
- identification of activities funded by the Australian Government through the PHN Program as opposed to activities funded outside the PHN Program.

The preferred background colour for the PHN Identifier is white. Alternatively, a white PHN Identifier may be applied to a Pantone 7693CP (blue) background.

Busy, patterned or photo backgrounds should be generally avoided. Do not apply print effects or adjust transparency.



# Incorrect use

To ensure brand consistency use only supplied logo files and do not alter the logo in any way.



The PHN Identifier must not be applied to busy backgrounds or backgrounds that compromise legibility.

The text of the PHN Identifier including the location name and 'An Australian Government Initiative' must be clear and legible; and when used with the Australian Government logo must be a minimum of 38.7 mm wide.



The proportions of the PHN Identifier must not be distorted in any way – neither squashed or stretched.

TT Norms is a font that has been chosen for its clarity and simplicity.

It is the preferred font for professionally designed projects for WQPHN (i.e. reports, posters, program workbooks, proposals etc).

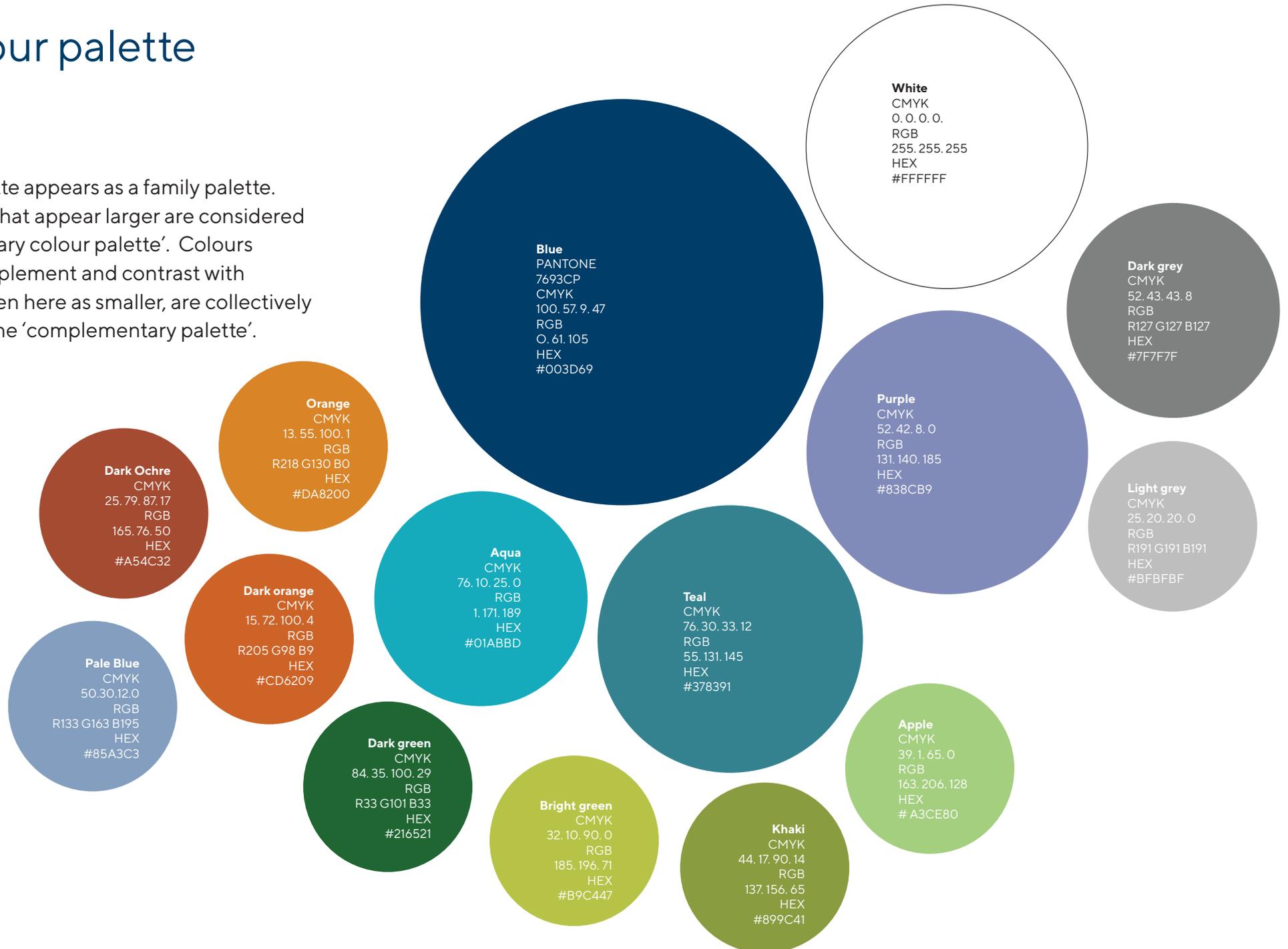

# Colour palette

The palette appears as a family palette. Colours that appear larger are considered the 'primary colour palette'. Colours that complement and contrast with these, seen here as smaller, are collectively termed the 'complementary palette'.



# WQPHN Community Petals

The circular formation of coloured petals embodies strength in unity, symbolising our dedication to fostering strong community connections and nurturing positive partnerships.

It reflects our commitment to providing holistic, integrated care that prioritises both individual and community needs.

Every petal is unique, celebrating our region's diverse landscapes and communities.

The petals can be used individually as shapes. They can be enlarged and cropped to include images or block colour to represent the Queensland rural landscape.



# Petal variations

When the petal appears large on a blue background, use the brighter colours in this order.

## Full petal

White petal is included when on navy background

Navy petal is included when on white background



# Co-branding

PHNs must follow the requirements below for use of the Australian Government stacked logo:

- The Australian Government logo must have at least equal prominence with other branding.
- Where possible, the Australian Government logo should be placed at the top of the item it appears on and be placed either above, or to the left of other logos in a side-by-side configuration.
- When displayed together, the line on the PHN Identifier drawn under the location and above the tag line 'An Australian Government Initiative' must be the same width as the Australian Government logo wording 'Australian Government'.
- Third parties contracted or commissioned by WQPHN are not permitted to use the Australian Government logo.
