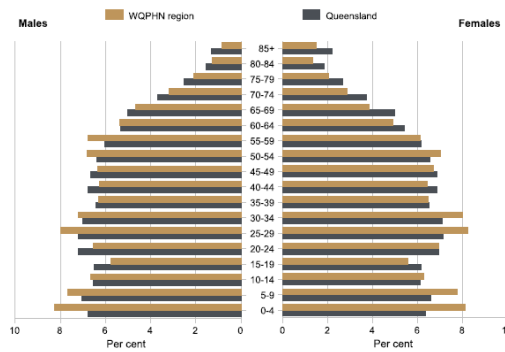


Figure 3 Estimated resident population by age and sex, WQPHN region and Queensland, 30 June 2016pr
